

College Report, 2023

Nurses are active workforce in health care delivery system of the hospital and community. Public awareness of health as a right, professional and technological advancement and increased demand for quality care and global nursing demands qualified, skilled and proficient nurses.

The College of Nursing, RG Kar Medical College, Kolkata was established in the year of 2008 to offer B.Sc. Nursing Degree Course with annual intake of 50 students. This college is under academic control of WBUHS, regulatory control of Indian Nursing Council and West Bengal Nursing Council and administrative control of DHS, Dept. of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of West Bengal. In 2016, Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Course with 50 students and M. Sc. Nursing Course with 15 students with three speciality, i.e. Child Health Nursing, Obstetric & Gynaecological Nursing and Mental Health Nursing were introduced. In 2019, seat enhancement done for B.Sc. Nursing total intake is 65, Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing 60, M. Sc. Nursing 25 with five specialities (5 students in each speciality). In 2020, after seat enhancement in B.Sc. Nursing total intake is 80, for Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing 60 and for M. Sc. Nursing 30 with five specialities (6 students in each speciality). Under PMSSS project 8 seats are sanctioned for the students from Jammu & Kashmir every year.

Student Strength

Presently the total Student Strength is 458 under different courses.

Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff of the College

Our Institution has qualified, well experienced faculty in Medical Surgical Nursing, Child Health Nursing, Community Health Nursing, Obstetrics & Gynaecological Nursing, and Mental Health Nursing speciality. They include Principal-1, Professor-2, Reader-1, Sr. Lecturer-4, Clinical Instructor-11 (1 on detailment to other institution) and Faculty Member-4 (on detailment from other institution).



Non teaching staffs include: Librarian - 1, UDC - 1, LDC- 3, Group D staff - 3,

Karmabandhu -2, Driver - 1, Security guard - 3.

We still require more teaching faculty to run the entire programme smoothly.

Vacancy Position

The post of Professor -1, Reader - 4, Sr. Lecturer -5, Clinical Instructor - 17 are still lying vacant at present. The post of Warden (3 sanctioned post), DEO are also vacant from the beginning of this college.

Infrastructure

College Building: College of Nursing, RG Kar MCH is situated in the 6th and 7th floor of academic building of RG Kar MCH. It has eleven classroom, one library with internet and wifi facility, 6 nursing lab, one auditorium, one conference room/ meeting room, and one examination hall with CCTV surveillance.

Hostel Building: There is no separate hostel building is present for the students, only few accommodations are available at BC Roy Nurses' hostel and RG Kar MCH.

Master plan is prepared every year before starting of the course following INC syllabus by the respective course co-ordinators and implemented in theory and practical area. Theory classes are taken by our Nursing teachers, as well as Guest Lecturers and clinical supervision is done by the Clinical Instructors.

In the clinical area the students are providing comprehensive care in preventive, promotive, curative and rehabilitative aspects and nature of care is holistic. 
4. Developing knowledge of influence of the family and the socio-economic conditions, which affect the individuals progress to the maladier and their attitudes and reactions.

Abstract

Triparna Dhawa, MSc. Nursing students 2022-23

A descriptive survey research design was adopted to find out assessment of adherence to medication and factors related to non-adherence to medication among patients with SLE attending out-patient department of selected hospital, Kolkata. The conceptual framework was based on Rosen stock's Becker and Mauman's Health belief Model. The non-probability purposive sampling technique was used to select 104 respondents. An un-structured interview schedule for demographic characteristics, standardized Morisky Medication Adherence Scale 8-item to assess adherence level and structured interview schedule for factors related to non- adherence was used to collect the data. The study findings showed that 73.07% respondents had poor adherence, 26.92% respondents had medium adherence while no respondents had good adherence to medication. With mean percentage of 88%, factors related to medicines stands out as the most important contributing factor of non-adherence. The most common reason were feeling fatigue to take medicine regularly (74.03%), believe on bad luck or karma(61.53%), unavailability of free medicines(82.69%), too many medicines per day (82.69%), could not come to hospital alone (77.88%), cost of medication (83.65%), distance between home and hospital (88.46%) which were cited as most contributing reason for non-adherence of respondents. The analysis showed that there was statistically significant association between adherence to medication with occupation, duration of illness (in years), duration of taking medicines (in years) at 0.05 level of significance. The study was concluded with the recommendation to find out the effect of interventional protocol to enhance medication adherence among SLE patients.

Abstract Lovely Khatun, MSc Nursing Student 2022-23

The investigator conducted a comparative study to assess the effect of virtual vs traditional demonstration programme on knowledge and skills regarding antenatal examination among 3rd year GNM students of School of Nursing, West Bengal. The conceptual framework was based on modified Ludwig von Bertalanffy's general system model. A quasi-experimental approach with two group pre-test post-test design was adopted. The total 43 student were taken by total enumerative sampling technique and divided into 2 groups randomly. An Unstructured, a structured questionnaire and an observation checklist was used to collect demographic information, knowledge and skills on antenatal examination. The findings of the study revealed that in group I calculated "t" value at df (20) for knowledge was 12.67 and in skill was 14.91 which was found statistically significant at p<0.05 level of significance, indicates that virtual teaching was effective regarding antenatal examination. In group II, calculated "t" value at df (21) for knowledge was 14.02 and in skill 20.26 which was statistically significant at p<0.05 level of significance, indicates that traditional demonstration was also effective. The independent "t" value between gr. I and gr. II for knowledge was


1.83 for df (41) and for skills was 7.19 for df (41) at 0.05 level of significance, indicate that though both methods are effective in improvement of knowledge and skills regarding antenatal examination, virtual teaching is much better for improvement of knowledge and traditional demonstration is much better than virtual teaching for improvement of skills regarding antenatal examination among 3rd year GNM stu-

dents.



Abstract Sagarika Dhara, MSc. Nursing students 2022-23

A descriptive study was conducted to estimate rationing level of nursing care and to find out the nursing practice environment factors associated with rationing of nursing care among 100 nursing staffs in intensive care units of selected government hospitals in Kolkata. The study was based on the Missed Nursing Care Model. Descriptive survey design was adopted. A total 100 nursing staffs were taken through consecutive sampling technique from three selected government hospitals in Kolkata. Modified MISSCARE survey tool was used to assess the rationing level of nursing care and nursing practice environment factors. The findings revealed that overall, the level of rationing of nursing care lain between never and rarely (M=1.32, SD=.20) among the staff nurses. Out of 100 participants, 47 participants reported missing at least one activity frequently or always. Rationing occurs the most in the care dimension of mobilization (M=1.75, SD=.51) and the least rationed dimension of care was documentation (M=1.09, SD=.32). As reported by the nurses the most significant nursing practice environment factors associated with rationing of nursing care was 'labor resources' (M=2.80, SD=.92). There was significant (p<0.001) relationship present between rationing of nursing care and nursing practice environment factors in intensive care units. It is recommended to disseminate the study findings to the nursing administrators as evidence of rationing of nursing care and to plan strategies effectively to reduce care rationing by minimizing the practice environment constraints.







ASSESSMENT OF KNOWLEDGE AND ATTITUDE ON PALLIATIVE CARE (PC) IN ONCOLOGY NURSING AMONG STAFF NURSES WORK-ING IN GOVERNMENT HOSPITALS, WEST BENGAL.

Introduction: Palliative care (PC) is the science of promoting quality of life of a patient, that is typically thought of as the intensive care given to a patient who is on the verge of passing away. Nurses need to acquire specific knowledge and abilities to provide quality palliative care. It has recently broadened its scope for the patients with cancer or end-stage organ failure but still have years to live. It is a strategy to enhance the quality of life for patients and their families dealing life-threatening illness by preventing and relieving suffering through early detection, accurate assessment and treatment of pain and physical, psychosocial and spiritual issues.

Aim of Study: Aim of present study was to assess the knowledge and attitude of staff nurses towards PC in Oncology Nursing, working in government hospitals, West Bengal.

Materials & Methods: The study was conducted using descriptive survey design. 60 staff nurses working in different government hospitals of West Bengal were selected as participants through non probability convenience sampling technique, following selected inclusion and exclusion criteria. Data related to sociodemographic characteristics of participants, their knowledge and attitude towards PC in Oncology Nursing were collected by the validated knowledge questionnaires and attitude scale respectively.

Results & Analysis: Study results have shown that among 60 participants, majority of them 96.7% (58) were female and maximum 90% (54) of them belong to 21-35 years of age group. Majority of them 53.33% (32) have working experience in tertiary care hospitals and majority of them have completed GNM course and presently pursuing Post Basic BSc Nursing. They have maximum 88.3% (53) working experience of 3-8 years in government hospitals. Only a few 3.33% (2) have attended any conference or workshop on PC in Oncology Nursing. Data also reveals that only 30% (18) respondents have good knowledge towards Palliative Care in Oncology Nursing and maximum 77% (46) participants have positive attitude towards the PC in Oncology Nursing. This data also reveals that there is no significant relationship between nurses' knowledge on PC in Oncology Nursing and their clinical experience (?2=0.767, df=1, p<0.05) and type of hospital they are working (?2=0.0974, df=1, p<0.05).

Discussion: The present study is supported by other studies, conducted by Sayej S. et al. (2015) [4], among 96 nurses 20.8% had good knowledge on PC and only 6.2% had good attitude towards PC. Another study by Fatemeh et al. (2019) [1] among 280 nurses working different department of GUMS and results indicating imperfect knowledge and their significant association with nurse's knowledge (P=0.038).

Conclusion: Although a few nurses may have good knowledge in PC in Oncology Nursing but majority of them have good attitude towards PC in Oncology Nursing. Recommendations are frequent workshop or in-service education on PC in Oncology Nursing should be arranged by the department for improvement of knowledge, as well as practice.



Report on Basic Neonatal Resuscitation Programme

Basic Neonatal Resuscitation Programme was held on 02/07/2022, 30/07/2022, 26/09/2022 and 28/09/2022 among 28 (Final Year B.Sc Nursing student), 32 (17 Final Year B.Sc Nursing student and 15 Post-Basic B.Sc Nursing Part - II), 32 (30 Post-Basic B.Sc Nursing Part - II, Post Basic B.Sc Nursing Student and 1 Faculty) and 28(23 M.Sc Nursing Part - II, Post Basic B.Sc Nursing Student and 1 Faculty) participants respectively.
